

Where does the custom of the Advent wreath originate?

The origins of this custom are lost in the mists of time, but probably are rooted in the pagan practices surrounding the winter solstice. As the days grew shorter, the number of lights in the home was increased to symbolize the desire for the return of the sun. Evergreens were shaped into circles and adorned with lights to symbolize the return of light and life. Our practice of using the wreath of lights during Advent started in 17th century Germany, but did not become widespread until the middle of the 20th century. Think of the Advent wreath as the church's clock counting down to Christmas!
